It also benefits from the adjacent city regions of Liverpool and Manchester.










There are a range of thriving businesses in the area but whilst Winsford Industrial Estate is high profile, many are surprising success stories lost in the rurality and scattered across the geography;








The Anderton Boat Lift is one of the Seven Wonders of the Waterways and provides a vertical link between two waterways. If castles are your thing, there is Beeston a former Royal castle on a rocky crag and Peckforton, a Victorian Country House built in the style of a mediaeval castle.

Whilst this is a rural area it is 'sophisticated green' where you're safe and well located.

Given the environment and nearby attractions hybrid working is attractive especially with Liverpool and Manchester so close.

Sir John Deane's Sixth Form College, established in 1557, has consistently topped league tables for outstanding results and is ranked the second highest achieving Sixth Form College in the country.





The area boasts great and friendly communities with lots of groups to join, plenty of facilities and things to do with numerous events and festivals throughout the year such as the

Northwich River Festival, Pina Colada Festival and the Middlewich Folk and Boat Festival.







LIVING YOUR BEST LIFE







There is a variety of businesses across the patch from tech to advanced manufacturing specialisms in defence, instrument engineering, packaging and plastics. Alongside these are IT, engineering and professional services companies.



Winsford Industrial Estate dominates the commercial presence, and there is a demand for entrepreneurial and start up space.

Middlewich plays a significant role as a logistics hub due to its strategic location, proximity to the M6, being home to major distribution parks and having key logistics companies in the area such as Wincanton.

Gadbrook Park is another of Cheshire's commercial hubs, located near Northwich. With direct access to the M6, it supports a diverse mix of national and regional occupiers across office, industrial, and logistics sectors.







There is further potential for growth given the location within or near the Liverpool and Manchester City Regions but transport within the area has room for improvement to enhance mobility. Live/work is a fabulous opportunity here given the place experience and environment and this may be important as the working age population is declining. Devolution also has the potential to kick start further growth, so Cheshire Central is well placed to become even more pivotal within the Cheshire economy.
